I am a social scientist and experienced research program manager interested in integrating biomedical, social sciences and ethics around HIV research. I have close to 15 years of experience in infectious disease-related work, including the social sciences of HIV cure research, HIV prevention, HIV treatment, Ebola, malaria and HSV-2. I currently serve as co-investigator on the Social and Ethical Aspects of Curing HIV Infection (searchHIV) working group and teach public health ethics at UNC Chapel Hill. I served as the Research Program Manager for the Collaboratory of AIDS Researchers for Eradication (CARE) at UNC-Chapel Hill from 2013 – 2015 and developed strong ties with community groups and biomedical investigators involved in HIV cure research. I have lead willingness to participate research in HIV cure in the United States. I am the co-founder and co-leader of the CUREiculum (<http://www.avac.org/cureiculum>), a collaborative program aimed at making HIV cure science accessible to the community and the HIV research field. In 2016, I also managed the UNC-CH - ClinicalRM - ELWA Ebola consortium. I have led a pox-protein prime-boost HIV-1C vaccine cohort development program, two HIV-1C prospective incidence studies and a clinical research site capacity development effort in Maputo, Beira and Chókwè, Mozambique with the United States Military HIV Research Program (MHRP)/Walter Reed Army Institute of Research/Henry M. Jackson Foundation for the Advancement of Military Medicine, Inc. (HJF) and FHI 360.
