Youth from 50 states in the United States, San Juan, Australia, Canada, Chile, Greece, Iceland, Ireland, Japan, the Netherlands, Switzerland, Taiwan, Thailand, and the United Kingdom have participated in *Safe Dates*; and *Safe Dates* is being used by the European Anti-Violence Network in Greece

Delivery of *Safe Dates* and *Families for Safe Dates* were required for the CDC Funding Opportunity (Released February 2011) "Dating Matters: Strategies to Promote Healthy Teen Relationships."

*Safe Dates* was one of two evidenced-based dating abuse prevention programs required to be delivered by communities funded from July 1, 2008 – May 14, 2013 under the National Robert Wood Johnson initiative “Building Healthy Teen Relationships Program.”

*Family Matters*, is included in CrimeSolutions.gov—a federal Web site for evidenced based programs launched 2011

Delivery of *Safe Dates* was required by communities in New Jersey receiving funds from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (New Jersey) for teen dating abuse prevention.

*Safe Dates* is being distributed in Iceland through a licensing agreement.

*Safe Dates* was translated into French through a study directed by a Swiss professor and is being implemented with adolescents in Switzerland.

*Family Matters* is being delivered by many organizations across the country. Training on *Family Matters* has been conducted in eleven states.
