I am a healthcare epidemiologist with a background in health administration who studies how the structure and process of primary and specialty care impacts chronic illness outcomes. Additionally, I am an implementation scientist and health services researcher. My work has focused on how healthcare systems may be able to develop and implement interventions and procedures to best prevent or manage the health of patients with chronic illness. As a result, my work has focused on the impact of care structures such as those encouraged by the Wagner Chronic Care Model and patient centered medical home. I have been involved in both clinical



trials and observational studies of mechanisms for delivering disease management (e.g. nurse-delivered behavioral phone calls, titrating the level of disease management resources to the clinical needs of patients, and group visits) and the study of programs aimed at improving the integration of care (e.g. efforts to improve the process of cancer screening, diagnosis, and treatment). Because my research focus is on the structure and process of healthcare delivery, I have been able to work on studies covering multiple disease states, primarily focusing on hypertension, diabetes, and cancer. The common theme is examining how to organize health systems and teams to enhance care delivery and outcomes. I have a particular interest in implementation science, examining how healthcare organizations implement healthcare innovations.
