#### Bio

Dr. Hua Wang is Professor of Environmental Economics and Management at Renmin University of China (RUC). Dr. Wang holds a Ph.D. in Environmental Management and Policy from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and worked before as Senior Environmental Economist at the World Bank's Development Research Group, Chief Expert in the Policy Research Center of China's Ministry of Environmental Protection (MEP), and Dean of the School of Environment and Natural Resources at Renmin University of China. Dr. Wang conducted extensive research in the areas of economic valuation of the environment and natural resources, policy instruments for industrial pollution control, environmental governance and sustainable development, in countries including China, the United States, the Philippines, Thailand, India, Armenia, Indonesia, Ghana and Ukraine, and published research articles in such leading journals as *Journal of Environmental Economics and Management*, *Journal of Development Economics*, *Journal of Economic Perspectives*, *Ecological Economics*, *Environmental and Resource Economics*, *China Economic Review*, and *Journal of Environmental Management*. He is also an initiator, designer and advocator of several environmental policy programs in China, including environmental information disclosure, color-coded industrial environmental performance rating, community stakeholder environmental dialogue, enviro-social governance policies and mechanisms. Dr. Wang is currently Chairman of the Chinese Association of Environmental and Resource Economists (CAERE, registered in Hong Kong, China), Council Member of the Earth Charter International Council, and Honorary President of the Professional Association for China's Environment.
