An “Interprofessional Substance Use Disorder Course to Improve Students’ Educational Outcomes and Patients’ Treatment Decisions” was introduced in the Spring of 2018 as a monthly course composed of both interactive class sessions and opportunities for counseling patients with SUD. This course is an effort that was designed to test the feasibility and impact of an interprofessional SUD course promoting students’ competencies in developing empathy, recognizing and addressing implicit biases toward SUD patients and bridging siloes between academic and medical care practices through interprofessional education. Assessment metrics for the curricular innovation included: Substance Abuse Attitude Survey (SAAS), to assess students’ attitudes towards individuals with SUD, and the Students Perception of Interprofessional Clinical Education – Revised 2 (SPICE-R2), to assess students’ attitudes toward interprofessional clinical education. In addition, the Behavior Change Counseling Index (BECCI) was implemented to assess students’ observed counseling skills.
