I am a senior social scientist and experienced research program manager who integrates biomedical, social sciences, ethics and patient engagement around HIV cure-related research in the United States. I have over 15 years of experience in infectious disease-related work, including the socio-behavioral sciences and ethics of HIV cure-related research, HIV prevention, HIV treatment, Ebola, malaria and HSV-2. I am the Principal Investigator/Project Director of an R21 NIMH grant integrating participant-centered outcomes and socio-behavioral assessments in AIDS Clinical Trials Group (ACTG) studies. I consult for several groups on socio-behavioral sciences related to HIV cure research, notably the UCSF SCOPE team, the amfAR Institute for HIV Cure Research, the BEAT-HIV Collaboratory (Wistar Institute), defeatHIV Collaboratory (Fred Hutch), the City of Hope/California Institute of Regenerative Medicine (CIRM), and the Ragon Institute of MGH, MIT and Harvard. I served as co-investigator on the Social and Ethical Aspects of Curing HIV Infection (searchHIV) working group at UNC Chapel Hill from 2014 – 2017. I also served as the Research Program Manager for the Collaboratory of AIDS Researchers for Eradication (CARE) at UNC-Chapel Hill from 2013 – 2015. I have led willingness to participate research in HIV cure in the United States. I co-founded and co-lead the CUREiculum (<https://www.treatmentactiongroup.org/cure/cureiculum-2-0/>) effort, a collaborative program aimed at making HIV cure science accessible to the community and the HIV research field. In 2016, I managed the UNC-CH - ClinicalRM - ELWA Ebola consortium. I led a vaccine cohort development program, two HIV-1C prospective incidence studies and a clinical research site capacity development effort in Maputo, Beira and Chókwè, Mozambique with the United States Military HIV Research Program (MHRP)/Walter Reed Army Institute of Research/Henry M. Jackson Foundation for the Advancement of Military Medicine, Inc. (HJM) and FHI 360.
