I obtained my MD degree from SUNY Buffalo in 1976, and trained clinically in pediatrics at the Phoenix Hospitals Associated Pediatric Program in Arizona. Following clinical training, I joined the Epidemic Intelligence Service of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in 1978, and worked as a medical epidemiologist for the CDC for six years including an assignment in Burkina Faso, West Africa and a Preventive Medicine Residency. I worked in Burkina Faso, West Africa for a total of five years, 1980-82 and 1985-87 before joining FHI 360.

I worked at FHI 360 from August 1987 until November 2012. During the first five years, I worked on preventing the spread of HIV in developing countries. I helped develop several computer models of the AIDS epidemic to help convince policy makers of the seriousness of the epidemic, and worked on surveillance and prevention projects in several African countries.

In FHI 360's biomedical research group from 1992 – 2012, I worked on research studies in the areas of male and female sterilization, and HIV prevention. I analyzed data and helped prepared a clinical presentation for FDA review of the Filshie Clip, a device for permanent female contraception. And I led FHI 360's research on clinical studies of vasectomy techniques. In 2008, I was a member of the American Urological Association (AUA) Committee on Vasectomy Guidelines, which published the first US Vasectomy Guidelines, in May, 2012.

During my last four years at FHI 360 I led a team researching a Chinese device for adult male circumcision, the ShangRing, for HIV prevention in Africa. I was PI for three Gates-funded clinical trials in Kenya and Zambia. The ShangRing was approved by the US Food and Drug Administration in 2012, and endorsed by the World Health Organization in June, 2015. In addition to its use in Africa, it is also starting to be used in the US and Canada, as it obviates the need for general anesthesia, which has often been used for traditional adult circumcisions.

After retiring from paid employment, I worked as an advocate for the development of new methods of male contraception. I co-founded a non-profit organization, the Male Contraceptive Initiative (MCI), which is the only non-profit organization in the United States focused on developing new, non-hormonal male contraceptives. In February, 2017, MCI issued a call for proposals for a grant of \$500,000, and awarded that grant in September. MCI has made numerous grants since then, totaling over seven million dollars as of February, 2022. I retired from the MCI Board of Directors in 2020.

I am an author of over 70 articles and obtained several patents for FHI 360. I speak French fluently, am Board Certified in General and Preventive Medicine, and am an Adjunct Associate Professor at the Gillings School of Public Health, UNC/Chapel Hill.

Since retiring from MCI, I have been volunteering with the Citizens Climate Lobby. I've recently become a cheerleader for Methane Action, and the Foundation for Climate Restoration.
