<b>Organization Description (Brief)</b>	The Center for Research and Training on Substance Use-HIV (CREATA-H) at Hanoi Medical University (HMU), established in 1994, is a leading Vietnamese institute focused on substance use and HIV research and training. Dr. Le Minh Giang has led CREATA-H as Chief Executive Coordinator since 2008, and Dr. Bui Thi Minh Hao oversees sexual health promotion. The center provides in-service training in HIV/AIDS and addiction medicine, offers technical support to various departments, and specializes in research on high-risk populations, including people who use drugs (PWUDs) and men who have sex with men (MSM). The Sexual Health Promotion (SH) Clinic, which is managed by CREATA-H, was founded in 2013 with NIDA grant support, aims to enhance sexual health and engage MSM, particularly male sex workers. It conducts street-based outreach, clinic-based counseling, and provides examinations, HIV testing, and STI screening and treatment.

Dr. Giang also holds an adjunct faculty appointment in the Department of Sociomedical Sciences, Mailman School of Public Health of Columbia University where he is an alumnus. Dr. Le's research interests focus on untangling the intersections between substance abuse, poor sexual health, and social determinants of health and reducing the burden of HIV, STD and other co-morbidities. Since 2012, he has been PI and Co-PI of several NIH-funded studies on epidemiology, prevention and treatment of substance abuse, STD, HIV in Vietnam. Dr. Giang has



professional public health experience.	mentored more than 20 graduate and post-graduate trainees, including two pre-doctoral trainees from the UCLA who were mentored by both Dr. Klausner and Dr. Le, and most of them have continued their research career. Dr. Giang currently serves as MPI in one D43 training program focusing on gender-based violence and as PD in another D43 training program focusing on implementation science in HIV. Both D43 training programs are housed by HMU.

<b>Description of the Proposed Practicum</b> (Describe the work experience and/or project: context, health problem, population)	The SHP has been providing HIV testing services and PrEP free of charge since May 2019, for more than 4,000 MSM and transgender individuals who are at high risk of HIV infection. Besides providing PrEP, the SHP clinic offers STIs screening and treatment (HCV, HBV, Syphilis, GC/CT); counseling and brief interventions for chemsex, substance use disorders and mental health. Students may gain experience in the comprehensive sexual health services and research initiatives provided by the Sexual Health Promotion (SHP) Clinic among MSM population in Hanoi, Viet Nam, including: 1) Contributing to analyses of STIs, HIV, and harm reduction data; and 2) Understanding the challenges and successes of sexual health promotion in Hanoi.
<b>Benefit to student</b> (How will this placement be of interest and benefit to a student?)	Student will learn about healthcare practices in a LMIC context, understanding the challenges and successes in addressing sexual health in a specific cultural setting.
<b>Roles and Responsibilities of the student</b>	Attend meetings and discussions related to proposed practicum; Respect clients and their various subculture and perspectives; Ensure all activities meet ethical requirements, including IRB approvals.
<b>Skills and Experience Required</b>	- Student from a university majoring in public health, medicine, social work, or a related field; - Good communication and interpersonal skills; - Strong track record of research and writing skills; - Knowledge of international public health, gender and/or human rights.

	<p>Or Project 2: 1) Meet with clinic leaders to identify immediate goals of the selected SHP program and identify process measures (e.g., acceptability, dose delivered, reach) towards achieving these goals; 2) Determine the data needed to conduct the process evaluation 3) Work with clinic staff to identify available and relevant hospital data, and potentially supplement with qualitative interviews with stakeholders; 4) Conduct a process evaluation resulting in a brief (approx. 5-page) report including: - Program description - Process measures - Data sources - Results - Recommendations - Appendix that includes the logic model used to guide the process evaluation, and interview guides if applicable 5) Prepare a 10-15 minute presentation and present the results to the clinic leaders.</p>
	<p>Or Project 3: 1) Identify a dataset from SHP clinic; clean and set up the dataset for analyses, in collaboration with the SHP/HMU data manager. 2) Meet with clinic leaders to identify an analysis of interest for the clinic; 3) Develop a manuscript/abstract using the SHP clinic data analysis results.</p>
